Headline	Hospital chiefs holding talks on full-face veils
First paragraph/s of article	A REVIEW is being launched over whether full-face veils should be worn within the health service, with 17 NHS hospitals having enforced bans and Dudley health chiefs saying they will discuss the matter further. The review over the religious headdress has been announced after Health Minister Dan Poulter claimed that face coverings can be a barrier to good communication between health care professionals and patients.
Paragraph relating to the Dudley Group	Dudley Group of Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust, which runs Russells Hall Hospital, said it was looking into the issue.
