People in the Dudley area are being given the chance to help shape local NHS services.

They are being urged to join patient panels to give feedback about healthcare, help identify priorities and be actively involved in the redesign of services such as the Russells Hall Hospital Emergency Department.

The panels are being set up by The Dudley Group NHS Foundation Trust, which provides hospital and community health services, with support from Healthwatch Dudley, an independent champion for people who access health and social care services.

Called The People's Network, it gives members of the public the chance to discuss and share knowledge about local services, inform policies and influence what local services look like, and have a real opportunity to feed back to decision makers.
