Information about services from Dudley Brain Injury Service for people who have a brain injury, their family and carers





What is Dudley Brain Injury Service?

Dudley Brain Injury Service provides support and information to people with brain injury, their family and carers.

The service is available to people who live in the Dudley borough and are aged between 16 and 64 years.

Dudley Brain Injury Service works with people with a brain injury, their family and carers, in finding ways to develop independence and quality of life.

Before a service can be provided the team will carry out an assessment and talk through any difficulties a person may be facing.

The team can make home visits to carry out assessments.



What services are available?

The team provides support and advice to people with a brain injury, their families and carers, including:

- information about brain injury;
- carrying out an assessment of need;
- providing a Case Manager to ensure clients receive a co-ordinated rehabilitation plan and programme;
- support to help people access specific information about issues such as benefits, housing, work and leisure;
- support to ensure that clients are referred to appropriate services;
- support to explore new opportunities in areas such as employment;
- providing education and training to care staff about the health and social needs of people with brain injury;
- acting as an advocate and liaising with organisations that provide services to people with brain injury;
- working in partnership with adult social care services, health professionals, rehabilitation services, Headway, support workers, education providers and employment services.
