STATEMENT FROM PAULA CLARK, CHIEF EXECUTIVE, THE DUDLEY GROUP NHS FOUNDATION TRUST

The Dudley Group is undertaking a retrospective review of a selection of maternity unit incidents, where patients may have experienced unexpected complications, to ensure our investigations process and the care of patients is to the highest standard. This is in response to a request from NHS England seeking assurance about learning from incidents.

We are looking at cases over a two year period and carrying out an in depth review of 25 out of the 9,000 births during that time. This review is taking a closer look at the process to investigate incidents, to ensure that we learn lessons and share that learning appropriately for the benefit of patients going forward.

We recognise this is going to be a difficult time for families and we will be liaising closely with them to ensure they have an opportunity to be involved in the review. We are working with local partners including the CCG and Healthwatch Dudley to provide oversight and openness through a quality improvement board.

We would like to reassure all users of our maternity unit that we are committed to providing the best service and that we learn from all incidents.
