FREEDOM OF INFORMATION REQUEST FOI/013419 - Delayed transfer of care

I am writing to you under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 to request the following information from the Acute Trust:

DTOC and Self-Funding Patients

1. How many self-funding adult social care patients waiting for placements causing DTOCs in 2015-16, 2016-17 and 2017 to date?

2. Are there currently any care home placements and / or care package brokerage services being offered to the self-funders at the moment?

For care home placements including self-funders we offer the service of Care Home Selection. This is a hospital commissioned service that will support families and patients in the search for a care home of choice. This is of no cost to the service user but does need consent from the user. Patients who are self-funding a package of care are not offered a brokerage service. Social Services provide a brokerage service for their own clients. Social Services may consider supporting patients and families who are unable to search for a care home themselves.

A&E Attendances are for DELIBERATE SELF HARM, INGESTION (+ ALCOHOL), PSYCHIATRIC.

Admitted via A&E is a subset of the cohort of patients in table one, they may not have necessarily been admitted with a mental health diagnosis.

Hospital Admissions is all patients with a primary diagnosis of mental health in the first admitting episode as an emergency admission.

Alcohol related admissions may not have a primary diagnosis that is attributed to alcohol and is therefore not as easy to identify.

3. Is there an Alcohol Nurse Liaison service available at the hospital

The Trust does not have an alcohol liaison nurse; support is via Crisis Team in ED. The Trust has access to the Drug and Alcohol Liaison Team (DALT).

Acute Bed Days DTOCs

Approx £277 per day in 16/17

Approx £4.834m in 16/17
