The Trust follows the Department of Health Guidelines in respect of assessing whether patients are ordinarily resident in the UK.

2. If yes, please answer the following questions:

A) Which patients undergo such checks? (– eg all those attending first appointment for a new care pathway) B) Please state what forms of documentation they have to provide? (eg passports, proof of address)

C) What happens if they cannot provide proof of being ordinarily resident?

In response to Q1, Q2(a) to Q 2(c)All patients commencing a new course of treatment should be asked the baseline question by frontline staff as per the Department of Health Guidelines, then if applicable an NHS eligibility form should be completed by the patient and evidence of residency should be provided. If the evidence is not available, the patient should provide the information direct to the Finance Staff. A clinical decision is made by the medic to treat immediately or wait for confirmation if eligible or not, for NHS treatment.
