We do not have specific FASD policy; but all children suspected of FASD are referred to a geneticist for genetic assessment. In Paediatrics, FASD is one of the differential diagnoses in children presenting with delay or behavioural problems especially in looked after children population.

The Community Antenatal care guideline covers lifestyle choices such as alcohol intake, to support prevention of FASD.

2) Any information you hold on services your Trust provided for FASD for

a. prevention education following the 2016 Chief Medical Officers' guidelines that the safest course is not to drink while pregnant or attempting to become pregnant;

We discuss this information at booking with all women. The pregnancy notes which are kept by mother include information about alcohol avoidance in pregnancy and all women are given a leaflet written by the FASD Trust at booking which also gives advise advice about avoidance of alcohol, the effects of alcohol use in pregnancy and how to get help if required.

NIPE training discusses looking for signs of FASD when completing the examination.
