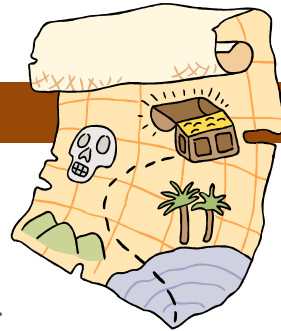
Ahoy there!
