Please confirm or deny if The Dudley Group NHS Foundation Trust has a specific policy on provision of support for all forms of infant feeding, specifically breastfeeding, formula feeding, and combination feeding.

We are a Baby Friendly accredited hospital and support families with their choice of feeding whether this is breastfeeding, formula feeding or mixed feeding. Our infant feeding policy provides further detail on this. The policy has recently been reviewed and is currently going through Trust processes so is not yet available.

Please confirm or deny if The Dudley Group NHS Foundation Trust holds information on the number of infants breastfed, formula fed, and combination fed.

We collect first feed data and report this data monthly. This identifies if the first feed is breast or formula.

Request 3

Please confirm or deny if The Dudley Group NHS Foundation Trust provides information on all forms of infant feeding (including breastfeeding, formula feeding, and combination feeding) at the 28-week antenatal appointment as outlined in the NICE guideline NG201, postbirth before the family has been discharged and at any other times.

Antenatally, a midwife has a conversation on individual basis offering the parent the opportunity to discuss comforting and caring for their baby. This covers building a relationship with baby, responsive feeding and the importance of close and loving relationships for baby's development. We also discuss with the parent their thoughts about feeding their baby. This is documented on the electronic record system in the planning for parenthood document. This conversation takes place between 28-36 weeks.

Postnatally before discharge home the midwife or maternity support worker will have a conversation about feeding baby and will complete a breastfeeding assessment or formula feeding checklist or both depending how they are feeding. The infant feeding team will support as required. We have an antenatal and postnatal padlets relating to infant feeding and relationship building.
