COMMENT FROM PAULA CLARK, CHIEF EXECUTIVE, THE DUDLEY GROUP NHS FOUNDATION TRUST

The paragraph in the Telegraph article re CRB checks does not relate to The Dudley Group.

The need for Trust staff to have a DBS check is assessed on a post by post basis and those identified as requiring DBS clearance will not start in post until this is complete.

All Trust volunteers have DBS clearance appropriate to their role and our volunteer recruitment process adheres to the NHS Employee Identification Scheme which ensures photo ID is verified prior to starting in post.
