Sarah Hughes, Clinical Nurse Specialist for the outreach team, paid tribute to her team.

"I'm very proud of the hard work of my team," she said. "They make sure patients receive the best standards of care and it's great that this has been recognised."

Christopher Davies, a clinical support worker in the Renal Unit, picked up first place in the Unsung Hero – Clinical category.
