I am writing to you today to ask: How many patients are currently being treated for moderate or severe atopic dermatitis (also known as eczema) ?

Please split these patients by their current drug treatment;

Potent Topical Corticosteroids [creams or ointments]

- Amcinonide 0.05% (Cyclocort)
- Betamethasone diproprionate 0.05% (Diprosone)
- Betamethasone valerate
- Clobetasol propionate
- Desoximetasone 0.25% (Topicort)
- Diflucortolone valerate
- Fluocinonide 0.05% (Lidex)
- Fluticasone proprionate 0.005% (Cutivate)
- Halcinonide 0.05% (Halog)
- Mometasone furoate 0.1% (Elocon ointment)
- Triamcinalone acetonide 0.5% (Kenalog, Aristocort cream)
- Betamethasone diproprionate 0.25% (Diprolene)
- Clobetasol diproprionate 0.05% (Temovate)
- Diflorasone diacetate 0.05% (Psorcon)
- Halbetasol proprionate 0.05% (Ultravate)
- Immunosuppressive therapies
- Azathioprine
- Ciclosporin
- methotrexate

The drugs listed may be used for treatments other than the treatment of eczema and the Trust's Pharmacy system does not hold information by disease or condition.

There are Dermatology clinics held at the Trust but there is no specific clinic for eczema treatment so we are not able to give numbers of patients who attend just for eczema treatment.
