## COMMENT FROM PAULA CLARK, CHIEF EXECUTIVE OF THE DUDLEY GROUP NHS FOUNDATION TRUST

We are delighted that a robust review carried out by the Dudley Children and Adults Safeguarding boards into allegations of unlawful restraint of patients at The Dudley Group has found that in every case, the restraint was necessary, proportionate and in the best interests of the patient.

West Midlands Police also carried out an investigation into the claims and found "no evidence of the unlawful detention of patients". Our own internal investigation also found the claims have no basis in fact and this was echoed by the Care Quality Commission findings.

We have always strenuously denied the claims published in local and national media, and we hope the reviews and investigations can reassure everyone that the welfare and safety of our patients, particularly vulnerable patients in our care, is our top priority.
