## COMMENT FROM DIANE WAKE, CHIEF EXECUTIVE, THE DUDLEY GROUP NHS FOUNDATION TRUST

We invited NHS Improvement to visit us to give us an objective view of our Infection Prevention and Control procedures. It was disappointing that they found some areas where we could do better and we are working hard to make improvements in these areas:

- Mandatory infection prevention and control training is now required every year for all clinical staff.
- Brand new alcohol hand rub and hand wash stations, alongside improved signage, have been installed at Russells Hall Hospital.
- A number of Trust policies have been reviewed and updated to make them more robust.
- Our Infection Prevention and Control Team are working closely with all staff to ensure basic infection control practices are business as usual.
