First paragraph/s of article	New figures showed not one penalty was upheld when challenged by irate drivers. The staggering statistics mean every person who took the time to appeal their fine from Russells Hall during 2015/16 ended up not having to pay a penny. Just over a quarter of drivers fined – 358 – appealed.

COMMENT FROM DR PAUL HARRISON, ACTING CHIEF EXECUTIVE, THE DUDLEY GROUP NHS FOUNDATION TRUST

We are advised by Summit Healthcare (Dudley) who provides our parking facilities that 358 successful appeals against fixed penalty notices were made between 1st April 2015 and 31st March 2016.

The vast majority of these appeals were from members of staff using the staff car parks for failing to display a valid parking permit. On checking our permit holder database to establish they had a valid permit, the fixed penalty notices were overturned by the Trust.
