## COMMENT FROM PAULA CLARK, CHIEF EXECUTIVE OF THE DUDLEY GROUP NHS FOUNDATION TRUST

Due to a national nursing shortage, The Dudley Group, like many other trusts, has been forced to look overseas to recruit qualified band 5 nurses with acute hospital experience. We plan to actively recruit from Europe in the New Year.

We recently advertised 18 additional nursing posts but were only able to appoint one nurse who had the necessary qualifications and experience.
