## COMMENT FROM DIANE WAKE, CHIEF EXECUTIVE, THE DUDLEY GROUP NHS FOUNDATION TRUST

Ward B2 at Russells Hall Hospital has been closed since 19<sup>th</sup> October 2017 due to a norovirus outbreak.

In the last 24 hours, we have had two new cases confirmed as norovirus with five other patients showing symptoms.

The virus was identified quickly and was contained using our usual norovirus procedures. No other areas were affected.

The ward has been closed to new admissions and staff working on the ward at the time the virus was identified have been rostered to work in that area only.

Our priority is to prevent the spread of the infection and so anyone wishing to see loved ones on the ward are advised to keep visits to a minimum, wherever possible. Staff and visitors are asked to wash their hands entering and leaving the ward.

Patients and visitors are asked to remain vigilant by not attending any of our hospital sites if they have experienced diarrhoea or vomiting during the previous 48 hours.

We also encourage patients and visitors to follow the same hand hygiene and other infection control procedures followed by our staff whilst visiting hospital.
