Press enquiry	The Express & Star has been told that a container of confidential records was stolen from Russells Hall Hospital around two weeks earlier. They have asked the Trust for a comment.

Trust response

COMMENT FROM DIANE WAKE, CHIEF EXECUTIVE, THE DUDLEY GROUP NHS FOUNDATION TRUST

A metal waste container was stolen from the back of Russells Hall Hospital, in an area covered by CCTV, on Thursday 5th October 2017 at 6.45pm. We are actively helping West Midlands Police who are investigating the theft.

The container held mixed paper waste excluding medical records. Medical records are managed away from Russells Hall Hospital.

As a Trust we send all paper waste for shredding and recycling. This would include such items as posters, leaflets, cardboard, magazines and anything else that can be recycled.
