As community paediatric neurobehavior team, alcohol during pregnancy is routinely enquired in assessing children with behaviour problem.

There is no established service for FASD in either paediatric or CAMHS services. There is no separate commissioning process for such services been established.

There is no consultant who has expertise although all are aware of FASD.

As there is no regional tertiary services, at present there is gap in service provision. Any child with FASD are supported in community with available services only with discussion in CAMHS or geneticist team.
